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Introduction

NORC at the University of Chicago analyzed data collected by Rice University under the Survey on Unwanted Sexual Experiences. NORC is an independent research corporation and is not a part of the University of Chicago. Rice University conducted this survey to determine the extent that unwanted sexual experiences or sexual assaults occur within the University community. The survey was designed by a University faculty committee in conjunction with peer institutions conducting their own surveys, based partially on a similar survey conducted by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology¹ and the “Not Alone” survey toolkit created by the White House Task Force to Protect Students from Sexual Assault². During the design phase, the faculty committee solicited feedback from a diverse cross section of individuals and students to inform the survey itself as well as how it was communicated about and administered. Survey Response Rate

A total of 5,585 undergraduate, graduate, and professional students were invited to participate in the survey. The initial survey screen offered three choices:

- CONTINUE, I wish to complete the survey.
- I understand this survey is about incidents of unwanted sexual experiences. I have not experienced this while at Rice.
- I do NOT wish to complete this survey.

Students who selected either of the first two responses were counted as respondents for the purpose of calculating the response rate, although students who selected the second response (“I understand this survey is about incidents of unwanted sexual experiences. I have not experienced this while at Rice.”) were not asked to complete the survey, but will be counted as having responded “No” or the equivalent to all survey questions.

Note that 40 students selected “CONTINUE, I wish to complete the survey” but then did not answer any of the survey questions; these students are counted as nonrespondents for the purpose of calculating the response rate and are not included in any of the other analyses presented in this report.

The overall response rate is 72.3 percent, which includes respondents who completed the survey (36.4 percent) and who indicated “I have not experienced this while at Rice” (35.9 percent). The numbers in the “Total” column under “Number Responding” correspond to the denominators of tables that include every survey respondent and are broken out by gender and/or student level (undergraduate vs. graduate student).

Among the non-responders, most (26.8 percent of invited students) explicitly refused to participate by selecting “I do NOT wish to complete this survey”, and only 11 students (0.2 percent) failed to open the survey at all. None of these students, nor the 40 (0.7 percent) who selected “CONTINUE, I wish to complete the survey” but then did not answer any of the survey questions, are included in the analyses in this report.

Table 1 shows the final response rates by subpopulation and overall.

Unwanted Sexual Experiences

The survey asked participants if they had experienced any of six types of behaviors without their consent since coming to Rice University, regardless of where the event occurred. For each of the six behaviors, respondents could indicate that they had experienced it once, more than once, that they had not experienced it, or that they were unsure. For each of the six behaviors, respondents were also asked to indicate whether the behavior was attempted (and unsuccessful) or successfully completed. All respondents who indicated at least one experienced behavior (attempted or successful) or were unsure were asked follow-up questions about the tactic or tactics used by the perpetrator.

Within each set of questions, respondents were asked separately about each kind of behavior or experience, and they could reply yes, no, or unsure for each one. Because each student could report more than one kind of experience, the percentages in the tables below cannot meaningfully be added up across the rows of the tables.

Although this report includes percentages of respondents who have experienced various forms of sexual misconduct in the tables below, it is not yet possible to draw conclusions from these results about the incidence of these events or the prevalence of these opinions across the University population as a whole. As with results from similar surveys recently conducted at other institutions, these numbers should be understood only to represent the incidence of such events among the students who responded to the survey.

Tables 2 and 3 present the results of the questions about the six types of behaviors among undergraduates, broken out by the semester the respondent matriculated at Rice. The “Others” category includes spring enrollees as well as those who enrolled earlier than the listed years. These other categories are grouped due to their small numbers to preserve confidentiality and to present the data in a manageable format. Table 2 displays undergraduates’ reports of completed behaviors, and Table 3 displays undergraduates’ reports of attempted behaviors. Because matriculation dates are known for all students, the percentages in these tables are among students who answered the survey as well as those who indicated “I have not experienced this while at Rice.”

Table 4 presents the results of the questions about the six types of behaviors among graduate students, including both completed and attempted behaviors. The percentages in this tables are among students who answered the survey as well as those who indicated “I have not experienced this while at Rice.”

Relationships with Perpetrators

Respondents who indicated experiencing at least one unwanted sexual experience since coming to Rice University were asked follow-up questions about the most recent experience, including their reported relationships with the perpetrator. Table 5 lists undergraduate respondents' reported relationships with the perpetrator of the most recent experience, and Table 6 lists the same information for graduate respondents. Respondents who indicated that they were unsure of whether they had had an unwanted sexual experience generally did not provide an answer to this question; the few responses that were received are not tabled to preserve confidentiality.

Tactics

Each respondent who indicated experiencing at least one unwanted sexual experience since coming to Rice University was also asked follow-up questions about the tactics used by the perpetrators. Respondents were allowed to select as many as they felt applied, and were also able to enter additional tactics (here represented in the column “Other”). Tables 7 and 8 display how often respondents, including both undergraduate and graduate students, experienced each combination of behaviors and tactics. Table 7 includes completed behaviors and Table 8 includes attempted behaviors. The percentages represent the occurrence among students who answered the survey as well as those who indicated “I have not experienced this while at Rice.”

Aggregate Counts of Experiences

Because Tables 2 through 4 cannot be summed across rows to understand how many respondents experienced at least one of the six behaviors, Table 9 shows aggregate counts of the number and percentage (among students who answered the survey as well as those who indicated “I have not experienced this while at Rice”) of students who experienced at least one of certain groupings of behaviors, including undergraduate and graduate respondents separately and together, further disaggregated by gender. Note that this table pertains only to completed behaviors. Table 10 shows the same information for undergraduate respondents, broken down by gender and the semester the respondent matriculated at Rice, using the same matriculation categories as Tables 2 and 3.

Dating and Intimate Partner Violence

Respondents were asked if, since coming to Rice, they had been physically or romantically intimate with anyone, including having been on a date, been in a romantic relationship, hooked up with someone, had sex with someone, or been married to someone. Respondents who indicated “yes” to any of these five questions were asked four additional questions about their experiences of physical abuse within these relationships, with the response options for each question consisting of “Never,” “Once,” “Occasionally,” and “Often.” Of the 2,034 respondents who completed the survey, 1,571 (77.2 percent) indicated they had been in one or more of these types of relationships. Table 11 displays respondents’ reported experiences of physical abuse, presented separately for undergraduate and graduate students and by gender, and includes all responses of “Once,” “Occasionally,” and “Often.” The percentages represent the occurrence among students who answered the survey as well as those who indicated “I have not experienced this while at Rice.”
